#### Meet calls for developing universal values

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM: A symposium on peace proposal presented by Daisaku Ikeda's, president, SGI (Soka Gakkai International) titled 'Universal Respect for Human Dignity: The Great Path to Peace' propounded the need to create universal values in individual lives here on Saturday. The symposium was organised by BSG (Bharat Soka Gakkai) at Gandhibhavan. BSG is the Indian affiliate of Soka Gakkai International, a global movement of people connected by Buddhism.

In his inaugural speech, former Indian Ambassador to the United Nations T P Sreenivasan said that UN agendas have expanded from preventing war to immunising children from all communicable diseases. He also pointed out the stark contrast between the "environmental colonialism" proposed by Indira Gandhi in 1972 and the "climatic justice" discussed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. "Disarmament and prohibition of nuclear weapons, a key pointer of the peace proposal is very significant taking into regard that India has not signed the NPT (Nuclear non-proliferation Treaty) till today. In all agendas of the UN, inputs of NGOs like these are very significant", he said.

Echoing the words of T P Sreenivasan, Deputy Chairperson of BSG Akash Ouchi said that the peace proposal does not originate from the interests of any particular nation or community. "The Goal is to create universal values in individual lives," he said. The three main pointers put forward by the proposal were humanitarian aid, ecological integrity and disarmament of nuclear weapons.

# Chronicle NGOs have a greater role to play in world peace

Can people or people's organisations make a substantial contribution towards world peace? The question was addressed in the inaugural speech of former diplomat T.P. Sreenivasan, at a symposium held at Gandhi Bhavan on Saturday.

The symposium was held to discuss a peace proposal submitted by Daisaku Ikeda, president, Soka Gakkai International(SGI), a global association of grassroots organisations promoting the ideals of human dignity. What role can organisations like SGI play?

peoples of the United Nations", not "we the governments". He said that more "resolutions are adopted by consensus than by vote. This we arrive at by continuous discussions and deliberations. Most often that consensus position is provided by the NGOs." He added that an NGO's view was welcomed better that one country's point of view.

The symposium was organised by Bharat Soka Gakkai, SGI's Indian affiliate and Ikeda Centre for Value Creation. Gandhian N Radhakrishnan, the centre's founder, said that Ikeda had been addressing the world body since 1983. He said while there was no dearth of literature on how to make the world a better place, the peace proposals of Ikeda spoke about change at the level of an individual.

BSG Honorary Deputy Chairperson Akash Ouchi spoke about "Universal Respect for Human Dignity", which was also the title of the peace proposal. He said that when one did not respect the dignity of human life, one was no better than animals. BSG Chairperson Vishesh Gupta highlighted the importance of one-on-one dialogues in achieving world peace.

The symposium concluded with a panel discussion on the peace proposal.

### 'Ikeda has made substantial contributions to UN'

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM: NGOs help the United Nations to arrive upon a consensus on several issues, said former ambassador T P Sreenivasan. "A good number of resolutions are adopted by the United Nations through consensus than by voting. Elaborate discussions and deliberations help the UN to arrive upon consensuses. Most often, a consensus position is provided by NGOs," he said. He was speaking after inaugurating a symposium based on Soka Gakkai International president Daisaku Ikeda's 2016 peace proposal. It was organised by the Bharat Soka Gakkai, Indian affiliate of the SGI.

According to Sreenivasan, over the years the UN has evolved a system in which people's organisations can apply for consultative status. The consultative status enables NGOs to submit proposals to the UN and to promote the UN ideas, he said. "In this effort Mr Ikeda has been a pioneer. He has acquired a reputation of making substantial and helpful contributions to the UN," Sreenivasan said.

Gandhian and founder of Ikeda Centre of Value Creation Prof N Radhakrishnan said Ikeda has made considerable success in influencing many decisions of the UN. Each Peace Proposal submitted to the world body and world leaders has well-articulated suggestions and appeals for sustainable peace and human transformation, he said.

Bharat Soka Gakkai chairperson Vishesh Gupta said the 2016 peace proposal highlights that dialogue will help in building strong and unassailable defences of peace in the heart of one individual after another.

BSG deputy chairperson Dr Akash Ouchi opined that universal respect for human dignity was the most essential requirement for world peace. "When we do not respect the dignity of other communities and nations, we are no better than animals. This unconditional respect is fundamental to building lasting peace in society," he said.
